The Christmas season may now seem in the distant past, but it was a joyous celebration. The two Christmas eve services were a splendor of lights, music and carols. A small, hardy group worshipped at the Christmas Day service without accompaniment by Karin, but with robust *a cappella* caroling nevertheless. Of course, the enduring vision of the services was the exceptional greening of the church, the flowers and the Advent wreath beyond compare. It's impossible to resist singling out the Flower Committee members - Bettyann Crowell, Rhea Brooks, Lynne Curtis, Michele Laferte, Bonnie Trowbridge and Barbara Watterson. Thank you to all.

The new year has begun with a flurry of activity. The transition committees are well underway in making preparations for the new Rector search, especially the Profile Committee. The Committee has obtained comments from the Vestry and Diocese on a draft of the church profile, and it plans to seek Vestry approval of the profile at the Vestry's meeting on February 17. Meanwhile, after extensive examination and discussion, the Vestry has decided that a full-time, rather than part-time, Rector would provide the best opportunity for a vibrant and growing parish, and it has approved a budget for 2022 that includes expenditures for a full-time Rector. Importantly, the Vestry is extending itself somewhat and showing its faith, because our steward-ship efforts thus far are short of our goal.

Sadly, we are approaching our last Sunday with Karin Larsen. Karin has been our faithful organist, pianist and choir director for almost nine years. It's hard to imagine services without her. This Sunday, January 30, will be the last opportunity to bid her farewell.

Finally, please plan to stay after the service on February 6 for the parish Annual Meeting. While the Meeting has previously been in the summer, for efficiency the Vestry has decided to move it to February and combine it with the Annual Finance Meeting. As with the preceding service, the meeting may be attended by Zoom.

Treasurer's Report

The January Treasurer's Report to the Vestry (which reports parish financials through December) was provided on January 20th. From a financial perspective, this is a very important meeting for the Vestry, with two major topics being addressed. The first is: How did we do last year? I was happy to report that we closed 2021 with a surplus of \$23,000. There are several factors that led to this surplus.

First, and most important, was your generosity! Nearly all pledge commitments were fulfilled, many exceeding the amount pledged a year ago. Overall, pledge income was a bit over \$16,000 above the budget. The second important factor was the receipt of the Payroll Protection Program loan of \$26,012 (now fully forgiven). This offset the loss of income due to COVID-related circumstances. Our building- use income was very small, as AA is holding their meetings elsewhere, and our fundraising income was zero, since we didn't hold fundraising events. Expenses were about \$16,000 below budget, mostly because Norman works 19 hours vs. Lynn's three-quarters time, and Norman is retired, so we do not pay pension expenses. The Vestry authorized me to transfer the surplus to our Reserve investment account. 2021 was a very good year for our investments. We had about a 15% return on the invested assets, and we also made healthy contributions to both the Reserve and 1914 Society accounts.

The second major Vestry topic was: What is the budget for 2022? I presented a balanced budget at the amount of \$247,560. Although "balanced" sounds good, there are some things to note and some risks. First, the pledge budget is \$220,000, and we are currently about 9% short of that. Our Stewardship group is working hard to resolve this, and I have a feeling that they will. I have observed over so many years the depth of support and generosity that is abundant in this congregation. The income side also depends on some fundraising activity this year. Hopefully, the COVID situation will improve as we get into summer and fall. The expense side doesn't have much latitude, as the vast majority of our expenses are fixed. Our Outreach program, so successful in 2021, is again funded at \$16,000. You will see more details on all of this at the Annual Meeting on February 6th.

The program has a comprehensive application and screening process, and very strict guidelines. We are looking for folks who may be interested in serving as Neighbor Advocates or serving on the Review Committee. We will provide all training for all.


A Blood Drive was held in December for the first time in our parish hall. With COVID, many drives have been cancelled and many donors who regularly donate have held off during the pandemic. Rhode Island Blood Services were very pleased with our drive and the turnout we had and were able to add several pints of blood to their supplies, and are looking forward to working with us again.

Dorcas International - We have begun work with Dorcas International Institute of Rhode Island. This agency is responsible for the resettlement of 150 Afghan families in our state. Transition Update

Preparations for the new Rector search are now in full swing. The Profile Committee met several times in December and January to prepare initial drafts of the parish Profile with the benefit of information generated at the two parish meetings facilitated by the Diocese's Canon to the Ordinary. This month, the Committee submitted a refined draft of the Profile to both the Vestry and Canon to the Ordinary, and based on their comments it is now completing a proposed version for the Vestry. The Vestry will then review the proposed Profile for approval at its monthly meeting on February 17.

The Profile will guide the Search Committee and be made available to candidates for Rector to inform them about St. Andrew's. In anticipation that the Profile will be approved soon, the Search Committee is holding its first meeting on January 27.

At its meeting on January 20, the Vestry supported the hiring of a full-time Rector and approved a budget for 2022 that includes the necessary funding.
