Pledge campaign for 2022 Giving Thanks!

The past three Sundays, parishioners of St. Andrew's have testified to their commitment to support the parish through financial contributions, as well as through their time and talents. Over thirty pledges have already come in, including from every member of the Vestry. Thank you!

As a result of the two well-attended after-church sessions with the Rev. Dr. Canon Dena Cleaver- Bartholemew and Vestry discussions, the need for a full-time priest as the next Rector has become clear. Parish leaders have urged their fellow members to consider increasing their pledges over last year's level. They have encouraged those who have already pledged for 2022 to consider going higher. A greater level of giving will make it possible to attract the right kind of experienced priest for St. Andrew's. The Vestry will also consider other ways to adjust the projected budget for 2022 to put the church in the best position to have a successful ministry together in the future.

The formal Giving Thanks Pledge Campaign will wrap up on Sunday, December 5. Pledges and revised pledges will still be warmly welcomed going forward, as the Vestry prepares the budget for 2022. Please pray about how you can best support the work of Christ through this parish in the coming year.

This year, the Angel Tree project is also back in full swing after being curtailed last year. As a participant in the project, St. Andrew's has volunteered to purchase and deliver Christmas presents for 52 children of incarcerated parents. Already, parishioners have taken care of almost all the children.

A special treat this Christmas season is that Norman will give a PowerPoint talk on art of the Annunciation after the Sunday service on December 12. As you've no doubt noticed, the Sunday service bulletins have been wonderfully enhanced with sacred art since Norman arrived. Norman has a particular interest in this genre, and the 14th and 15th century photographs of Annunciation paintings in the November 28 bulletin are examples of what we can expect to learn more about on the 12th.

Treasurer's Report

The November Treasurer's Report to the Vestry (which reports parish financials through October) was provided on November 14th. Pledge income was a little below budget in October, and we continue to be ahead of budget for the year through October. With your most generous support, I think

we are on track to complete our year-end pledge goal. Our investments were up about 4% for the month, as the markets were great in October. Both our 1914 Society endowment and Reserve funds have appreciated almost 15% for the year. October expenses were well under budget and through October we are 3% under budget. Looking forward, our Payroll Protection Program (PPP) loan will greatly help us maintain operations as opportunities for other sources of income, such as building use fees and fundraising event proceeds, are narrowing due to COVID and other concerns. We have received word from the bank that the PPP loan has been fully forgiven.

Your treasurer, the Finance Committee and the Vestry will be very busy in December and January as we prepare the operating budget for 2022. Key in this process will be finding the resources so that we can achieve our goal of finding a wonderful full-time Rector next year. The results of the ongoing stewardship mission is so important in achieving that goal, so please be as generous as you can. The Annual Financial Meeting will be held in early Febrary and you will see how 2021 wrapped-up financially and what 2022 will look like. I want to express my thanks to all of you for your generous support during these trying times. For the past 107 years, St. Andrew's has always come together to meet the challenge, and you are upholding the tradition!
