



# St. Andrew's by-the-Sea

As Advent commences, we are called to ponder whether we are spiritually well positioned to respond to John's proclamation, "Prepare the way of the Lord!" At the start of this liturgical New Year, what is the fresh start or the new beginning that we need to make in order to connect more deeply with our Lord Jesus? Are we feeling wounded, alone, anxious, or fearful? Is there a spiritual habit or practice that we could adopt that would strengthen our faith and our hope? Are we looking for God in the small, seemingly insignificant or random, unexpected, and often vulnerable places and people we encounter? Do we have a personal relationship that needs our focused attention, renewed effort, and reconciling initiative? Do we really believe that God loves us just as we are this very day; not as we want to be, or try to be, or hope to be someday down the road?

I invite us to consider two questions in this holy season of hope and expectation. Since we are made by God in God's image, where do we see that sacred image and holy intention in our own lives? And since we know that God strengthens us to do all things, where have we witnessed and felt that transforming love and uplifting energy in our lives over the course of this particular year? As we ponder and pray together, let's remember that as disciples we are called to bring the light of God into the world. Lord knows the world desperately needs light right now! So Lord, please help us to shine! And help us remember and understand that God's love shining in the darkness is a powerful sign for us of what God's gracious and merciful love looks like.

As we seek to prepare "the way of Lord" in this holy season of Advent, I want to emphasize that waiting for the Lord to be born again into our hearts and homes is NOT a passive activity. And it isn't about the hustle and bustle of the secular society in which we live and work. As we prepare to once again welcome the infant Lord Jesus, the holy invitation is for us to engage only in those Christmas occasions and activities that bring us authentic joy. This time of patient waiting and spiritual preparation urges us to pray, to read the Word, to sing, to put

# Treasurer's Report

The October/November Treasurer's Report to the Vestry (that reported on the September and October financials) was provided on Nov. 16<sup>th</sup>.

On the income side, receipts during October & November were above budget (\$33,546 vs. \$32,128). More good news is that year-to-date we are \$22,147

above the income budget. Expenses for the 2 months were below budget (\$31,526 vs. \$37,851), and year-to-date we are also below budget. Our investments were down about 6.5% during September and October, reflecting the volatility of the market. Overall, since January, our 1914 Society Endowment and Reserve investments are up about 3%.

The 2023 stewardship mission had a pledge commitment of \$217,500 with 52 pledges. Through mid-November, we have received \$197,850. Given our usual pledge cycle, we should be able to meet our goal at year-end.

November and December are busy financial planning times for your Treasurer, the Finance Committee and the Vestry. I have started the preparation of the 2024 budget, and the Finance Committee will review it in early December. The Vestry will review the budget in draft form later in December and will vote to approve it in January.

I want to express my thanks to all of you for your generous support. For the past 109 years, St. Andrew's has always come together to meet the challenge, and you are upholding the tradition!

She thanks us all for our support and asks for continued prayers for her and her family.
